OVERVIEW


- Why project and review management matters...
- Duh...
- Yet project and review management often get short shrift in the need to get the project done.
- But consider some war/horror stories...
 - Conditional tags gone wild...
 - Broken links...
 - Undocumented styles...
 - Unmanageable review comments...

OVERVIEW

- Flare, Central, and Contributor offer a variety of project and review management features.
 - Flare Report, file tag, Analysis features, and writing a project description.
 - Central Task management, review and contribution coordination features.
 - Contributor Review and contribution coordination.

- Report generator.
 - Built into Flare.
 - 128 different reports in 19 categories.
 - By category group or specific reports in a category.
 - Can be viewed online and discarded or archived, and printed.




- Report generator.
 - Demo

- File tags.
 - 128 predefined reports is good but what if the one you need isn't there?
 - Create your own using file tags.
 - Your own keywords that you can create, assign to any element in a project – topics, snippets, etc.
 - Can then search for and report on.

- File tags Creating.
 - File > New > File Tag Set.



- File tags Applying.
 - Properties dialog box.



- File tags Reporting.
 - Demo report on a specific file tag.
 - Demo report on file tags in general all topics with file tags, for example.

- Analysis feature.
 - The new version of the Analyzer package but with less-used features removed.
 - Many options in the Analysis feature are similar to those in the Reports feature.

- Analysis feature.
 - For example, here's the Broken Links report from the Report feature.





- Analysis feature.
 - And here's the Broken Links report from the Analysis feature.




- Clicking it opens the topic with the broken link.
- So the Analysis feature actively helps you fix the error, unlike the static Report feature.

 - More reports.

 - Still more reports.

- Writing a project description.
 - Always document your projects for your benefit and that of your successors.
 - Otherwise, <insert horror story here...>
 - I wrote a book about it:





- Writing a project description some things to include.
 - Project description.
 - Configuration requirements.
 - Audience description.
 - Information types.
 - Access into the project and navigation once in it.
 - Authoring tool specs.
 - Authoring workflow.
 - And more...

- Writing a project description how can Flare help?
 - Write the project description in topics in the project itself.
 - Add comments within the "real" topics.
 - Create a condition called "author's notes," apply it to the topics and comments, and exclude them from the output.
 - Use the Report feature to create a report that lists all files that contain condition tags.

- Writing a project description how can Flare help?
 - Make notes in topics by using the Annotations feature (Review > Insert Annotation).
 - Use the Report feature to create a report that lists all topics that contain annotations.


- Writing a project description...
 - Use the internal commenting features to describe styles, conditions, variables, anything with a Comment field.






CENTRAL

- A version control system that also has project management features.
- Hosted by MadCap, good if you need version control but can't run it yourself and don't have IT support.
- Accessible via Flare or your browser.







Task Board




CENTRAL PORTAL – TASKS

Creating a task.




CENTRAL PORTAL – TASKS


 Keeping track of tasks – optional email notification.




- Easy to use from
 Flare Review >
 Send for Review in
 Packages group on
 ribbon.
- Displays this screen.
- Select the Central option.




- Then select the SMEs.
 - I have Admin rights so I'm included automatically.
- Click Send.
- SMEs get notified by an email with a link.
- Clicking the link takes
 SME here...



Here's the list of sent review packages.



- Select the desired package to open it.
- Notice the very limited editing interface.



- Make your changes and click a Submit button to return the file.
- Flare author gets an email notification.
- Opens the returned file in Flare.
- Accepts or rejects the changes.
- Accepts the finished topic file back into Flare, overwriting the previous version.

CENTRAL

Advantages:

- Convenience Offers version control without needing internal resources.
- Project management Offers project and review management features as a bonus.
- Easy to learn For authors and reviewers/SMEs.
- A "platform" (IMO) For future feature additions.

Drawback:


External hosting – Some companies don't like this.

CONTRIBUTOR

- Can't use Central there's Contributor.
- Available in two modes.
 - Free review version lets SMEs review and annotate topics from authors and return them for incorporation into the Flare project.
 - Full version lets authors create templates, send them to SMEs for use creating "clean" material for incorporation into the project.

CONTRIBUTOR – FREE VERSION

- Easy to use from Flare Review > Send for Review in Packages group on ribbon.
- Displays this screen.
- Select how to send the package.



CONTRIBUTOR – FREE VERSION

- In the end, you've created an email for the SME with a link to open the topics and download the review version of Contributor if necessary.
- Or directly to Central with no need to download anything.
- SME changes and annotates the topic in a light version of Flare, then returns the result to the Flare author.

CONTRIBUTOR – FULL VERSION

- Full version includes the review mode but also lets you create contribution templates.
 - Create the template-to-be as a topic in Flare, with prompts e.g. [type the description here...].
 - Use Review > Lock to lock elements that you don't want modified.
 - Select Save > Save as Contribution Template.
 - Send that template to the SMEs.
 - The SMEs fill out the template using a light version of Flare, and return the result to the author.

CONTRIBUTOR

Advantages:

- Legibility No need to read SMEs' handwriting.
- Technical cleanliness No more importing Word files full of local formatting.
- Authorability control Can lock parts of the template to control what the SME can author.
- Flare compliance Files slip easily into the project without an import.
- Easy to learn Can be taught to SMEs in 45 minutes, 5 page cheat sheet.

CONTRIBUTOR

- Drawbacks:
 - Change management SMEs may not want to learn a new application that mainly benefits you.

SUMMARY

- Many deliberate and serendipitous management features.
- Always interested to hear about new ones that I haven't mentioned here.
