

People often ask:

^ How do you control biting and nipping?

Biting and Nipping

The most important things you can teach your pup are "Come," "Wait," "Stay," "Don't," and BITE INHIBITION.

A perfect "heel," "Sit," or "Shake Hands" are of little value when your pup runs into the street and is hit by a car.

"Come" (approach your person's loving arms without fear of ANY punishment), "Wait" (Do not cross the threshold until your person tells you), and "Stay" (Freeze in position, do not move until your person releases you), "Don't" (Do not pick up stuff from the ground/floor), are self explanatory.

BITE INHIBITION, however is not very well understood, even by most trainers and veterinarians.

NEVER, NEVER, NEVER, put your hand around his muzzle, shake it, and yell "No Bite!"

NEVER, NEVER, NEVER, stick your fingers in the back of your pup's mouth until he gags.

NEVER, NEVER, NEVER, jab your finger nail into your dog's tongue.

HTML5 Skin Editor Updates

The Skin Editor includes a slight redesign that improves navigation and editing capabilities. The updates are most evident in its Styles tab and Setup tab. There are a few new style groups and properties pertaining to micro content and proxies.

Truncated and Dynamic Skin Options

In the Skin Editor Styles tab, the user interface has been changed. The skin options (i.e., style group and properties) are truncated and dynamic (i.e., displayed or hidden) based on what is applicable to the selected skin and setup options. Instead of the style groups and their properties showing in one long column, the style groups are in one section while their corresponding properties are in another.

Biting and Nipping

The most important things you can teach your pup are "Come," "Wait," "Stay," "Don't," and BITE INHIBITION.

A perfect "heel," "Sit," or "Shake Hands" are of little value when your pup runs into the street and is hit by a car.

"Come" (approach your person's loving arms without fear of ANY punishment), "Wait" (Do not cross the threshold until your person tells you), and "Stay" (Freeze in position, do not move until your person releases you), "Don't" (Do not pick up stuff from the ground/floor), are self explanatory.

BITE INHIBITION, however is not very well understood, even by most trainers and veterinarians.

NEVER, NEVER, NEVER, put your hand around his muzzle, shake it, and yell "No Bite!"

NEVER, NEVER, NEVER, stick your fingers in the back of your pup's mouth until he gags.

NEVER, NEVER, NEVER, jab your finger nail into your dog's tongue.
